Reframing Missions

Thank you for partnering with us in 2022. You have played a critical role in sharing the gospel where His wonderful name has never been heard.

Recently a good friend and "traditional" missionary shared with me: "In the Muslim world, Filipino maids have done more for the spread of the gospel than all traditional missionaries put together." This statement rocked my concept of missional structures and who God uses to build His kingdom.

In the past, it was thought that to be "in ministry" or to work as a "missionary" a person had to leave their job, get special training and join a certain type of organization. Some have felt that special call, but many did not feel a personal responsibility to participate in what God is doing in His world. I believe many have felt excluded from the mission of God.

There are still over 3 billion people globally who

have limited or no access to the gospel. What if every Jesus follower could fully participate in changing that? Every doctor, teacher, taxi driver or home-schooling mom engaging in neighborhoods, both here and abroad, by being salt and light.

If we are to see the WHOLE body of Christ fully in the mission of God, in its totality, then we will have to reframe how to articulate missions. The definition cannot be narrow for a few select people. We need to take a step back and say, "No. God's mission is bigger. God's mission is for everyone to be involved in and includes all of creation." It includes you.

In 2022, many Jesus followers like you stepped out in faith, using their God-given skills and passions to bring vibrancy and transformation to communities around the world.

This year we invite you, along with many of our partners, to journey with us in reframing missions as we share together the love of our Savior, reversing the trajectory of the lost.

Worldwide, OM has established a new **Holy Ambition** embraced by all workers. It declares that by 2030, OM seeks to catalyze 25,000 new vibrant communities of Jesus followers.

We want to see God's love shared in places where:

- No one is sharing the life and teachings of Jesus. (In Afghanistan the average person will hear the gospel only once every 30.5 years.)
- No local community of Jesus followers has formed. (In Japan there are over 1,700 villages without an evangelical church.)
- Culture, language and other barriers separate people from local Jesus followers. (Among millions of Ukrainian and Syrian refugees in Europe.)

Vibrant Communities

Groups of **believers** who practices worship, prayer, baptism, breaking of bread, service, witness, giving, fellowship and Bible study.

Body of Christ groups

Groups with **some believers** who meet regularly for Bible study and teaching.

Small groups

Groups meeting around the Word of God in some way. They may be **seekers** and not yet believers.

Ukraine response

On February 24, 2022, Russian forces invaded Ukraine under the orders of Russia's President Putin. The next day, OM's response began.

With teams ready to respond and relationships with local churches already in place, volunteers manned crossing points at the Polish and Moldovan borders, providing practical support to the most vulnerable people leaving the country in search of safety. OM and local churches offered hot meals and more to people as they waited, engaging in many spiritual conversations, listening to people in crisis and praying for those in need of comfort and hope.

BEYOND THE BORDER

...In Ukraine, OM supported local pastors who continued to serve in occupied areas, distributing relief food packages, praying for community members and transporting people to safety. Several OM workers stayed throughout the conflict, offering hope to their neighbors, directing the distribution of aid coming from surrounding countries and transporting people to the borders.

...In Moldova, OM offered temporary accommodation for several people fleeing the war with nowhere else to go. The team drove supplies into Odesa, Ukraine, where they were relayed to the eastern front. ...In Romania, OM partnered with local Jesus followers and churches to support displaced Ukrainians in practical ways and organized events to share God's love with them.

...In the Czech Republic, OM partnered with local churches to run summer camps for Ukrainian children and to teach resettled Ukrainians Czech and English.

...In Poland, OM and local churches partnered with OperationSAFE (OpSAFE), an organization that trains communities in child trauma psychological first-aid intervention, to run five day camps for children who have experienced community trauma.

Go **boldly**

Most of the Church lives outside the West. Here a new workforce has emerged, ready to share their faith. Historical mission methods do not work in their context. A generational reframing now makes their everyday life central to gospel living.

Though foreigners are still essential in bringing their jobs to certain least-reached regions, local new believers are critical in reaching their own people. Cultural understanding and sustainable living allow them to bring immediate impact. Same-culture workers are reaping the growth of vibrant Jesus-follower communities.

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NORTH INDIA

Jesus-following communities

"I think that the greatest joy of my life is seeing a Muslim family coming to know the Lord," Bir* said. "My life is for them, and I want to spend the rest of my life sharing the gospel with Muslims."



Bir works to share the gospel and raise Christian leaders among the Muslim community in northern India. He serves with a variety of ministries and partners with OM to provide training and resources to Jesus followers across the country.

Bir and a team of eighteen full-time team members live and work in an area where there are more than 60 million Muslims. He describes the task of sharing the gospel in India as a mountain sitting before them. Yet, just as Jesus used the small fish to feed thousands in abundance, He can do the same with a small team among millions.

God has brought many people to faith in Jesus, but new followers need guidance and direction to know what comes next. The team's goal in northern India is to disciple believers and teach them how to find their hope in Jesus so that they can stand strong through persecution and other challenges. In order to disciple all those who come to faith, India needs more Biblical leaders.

In 2022, the team trained and sent 105 new leaders all around northern India —men and women from a Muslim background who

"In 2022, the team trained and sent 105 new leaders all around northern India..." portrayed servant-leader attitudes and a passion for the gospel. During training, new leaders learned about the character of God, how to study the Bible, church planting and leadership.

Though Bir grew up in a Christian home, he stressed the importance of raising leaders from a Muslim background to minister in their own communities. "There are people already in the community that God is at work in their lives. Finding the right person of peace or house of peace is the key, and that is where you know the ministry really expands and multiplies," he said.

Victoria takes her job to the Middle East

Initially, taking a nursing job in the Middle East wasn't on Victoria's radar. "My first love is working with pediatrics," says Victoria. And having spent the past few years as a travel nurse, she wasn't one to shy away from the unknown.

After seeing a post on Instagram, Victoria connected with a coach who shared Scatter Global's vision to see Jesus followers living out their unique, God-given shape in every industry and every place – especially areas of the world where Jesus is less known. She also learned about global job opportunities that matched her skillset and more about the recruiting partner who would walk her through the entire process from interview prep to contract negotiations and visa paperwork. To Victoria's surprise, one job happened to be in a hospital her mentor not only knew but had personally visited.

After a few days of caring for one of her young patients, Victoria found herself sitting on the floor with her patient's mom and having tea. "I was giving her advice, she was giving me advice and she felt like a friend," she remembers fondly. When her son was readmitted sometime later, she confided to Victoria that none of her friends reached out. She felt really alone. "As a nurse, you always have to build rapport with your patients (but) as a foreigner, people (here) are extremely intrigued," Victoria says. From questions about why someone would come all this way for a job, to conversations about life and culture, there are always opportunities to connect.

"I think foreigners have the opportunity to have influence and share their lives with others in a unique way."

Training local leaders to go boldly

Sharing Christ's love in rural mountainous regions can be an almost impossible task. Houses dot the ridge lines and only small clusters of homes sit in the valleys, isolated from others by a lack of roads.

Saajan^{*}, an OM worker in a mountainous area, is passionate about sharing the love of God in his home country. The district where Saajan serves is home to around 144,000 people. To navigate the rugged mountains, pastors often walk one or two days to get to church members' homes. Individual Christians may only sporadically attend church services because of the far distances and physical isolation.

"Through this wide literature distribution, Saajan's teams formed about six or seven small fellowships of people interested in knowing more about Jesus," Saajan's leader, Won*, shared. "Then, after a few months, we look for someone within that fellowship that we can raise up as a leader and invest in training more."

Pastors were strengthened in their missional vision, local Jesus followers were discipled in their faith, and people who had never heard of Jesus received literature and follow-up conversations.

"Without cooperation with local churches, OM cannot achieve the vision to see every household reached. Local churches are the key," said Won. "OM also supports these churches with training and resources, and we listen to them and their vision and look for ways to partner with them. This approach takes time to build trust."

Sow broadly

We live in a modern era where the written and spoken Word is accessible to all.

From print, television and radio to influencerdriven social media, we broadly sow a more contextually relevant gospel among people groups. We share the love of Jesus through channels that touch hearts at the right time.

Thank you for your partnership as it allows us to use technology to broadcast the gospel to millions. Many of these listeners do not even know just one Jesus follower.

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Audio Bibles and Transformational Business

Moussa*, an African believer from a Muslim background, makes a 30-minute journey daily from his home in town to a garden plot. Sometimes five to 20 men gather there as well. Some go to work; some go to collect water. Most go for the conversation. "Before, it was very difficult to share the gospel among a group of non-believers. But now in the garden project, we share the gospel openly," Moussa said.

In the two years since Moussa began going to the garden plot, 20 men gave Christ their lives. As the new believers seek Jesus and how to be more like Him, their lives are radically changed.

Adam^{*} learned about the garden from his cousin, who owned a nearby farm and suggested he look there for work. Moussa hired Adam and a few others to make bricks to build a wall. Adam quickly noticed that the work environment was completely different than he had experienced elsewhere. Moussa shared about Jesus and gave him an AudioBible. After Adam listened to Scripture, he asked Moussa about what he had heard. "He explained it to me until I came to total conviction that this faith is of God and Jesus died for my sins!" shared Adam.

OM USA's Church Connections team connected two churches in Georgia and Florida to contribute startup funds for Moussa's new business. He purchased two freezers and equipment to start selling ice water, yogurt, drinks and household utensils. Profit each month provides income for Moussa's family and further investment into the business.

SWEDEN

Social media among the _____ diaspora

When Jared* and his young family moved from South Asia to Scandinavian Europe, they joined a global diaspora community of millions. Instead of seeking economic advancement, Jared followed God's leading in faith, leaving both secure employment and extended family in his quest to share God's love with Muslims.

Individually, ethnic European Jesus followers often struggle to share their personal faith. "[They] are not used to talking about faith, not even in their own family," explained David*, a former leader of OM's work in Sweden. South Asian culture, on the other hand, revolves around religion.

Retaining his professional identity as an accountant and integrating into the community through his other interests, like sports, Jared spends his days being salt and light to people who don't know Jesus. "He's doing the same "Jared spends his days being salt and light to people who don't know Jesus."

kind of sharing that we are doing in the Middle East [and other creative access countries]: building friendships, building trust and sharing the gospel a little bit slowly," David said. That intentionality is necessary, particularly in neighborhoods like Jared's, where immigrants are less likely to fully assimilate into their new culture.

In late 2020, Jared created a group on social media to provide a platform for interfaith conversation. The group has since grown to more than 1,700 members—80 percent Muslim and 20 percent Christian, Jared estimated. He also said that the gender and age demographics of the group, where a majority of the members are men ages 18 to 34, matches those missing from traditional churches, making his media platform especially strategic.

One Christian man living in the Middle East told Jared via private message that he was struggling with the constant questioning



of his beliefs by Muslims. "He was doubting Christianity and very close to losing his faith," Jared said. After joining the group and reading other believers' responses to some of the same questions, the man messaged Jared again: "Through your group, my question was clear, and I came back to my faith. And I'm also now able to give an answer to the Muslims."

AFGHANISTAN

30 Years of Radio for Afghans

Radio has been the backbone of OM's partner Afghan media ministry for the last 30 years.

Afghan Christians have produced radio programs from the start. They also gradually began to write their own scripts directly in the Dari language.

Remembering those early days, one brother reflects, "We had come to Jesus and had such joy and zeal. We left everything to share the hope of salvation with our fellow Afghans." There were challenges: "Our office was in our home, and with Muslim friends visiting, we were nervous at times. We moved houses several times for security reasons. Thank God that He protected and empowered us to go ahead."

Another said, "We didn't know if it would bear fruit; we wondered if anyone was listening to our broadcasts?" When we received the first letter from a listener we were so encouraged, "This person's appreciation and courage to write was a huge boost for us... we began answering letters from listeners and sent Bible portions and cassette tapes. Eventually we created programs where we read listeners' questions and answered them on air."

Since the first broadcast, there have been thousands of programs with over 20,000 hours of Christian radio sent into Afghanistan! Today people call us saying things like: "My father used to listen to your programs and call you. Now I love listening to the afternoon programs with my family."

Radio remains a popular, affordable and accessible media in Afghanistan. Most households in Afghanistan have access to radio, either by tuning in with a traditional radio set or listening online on their smartphones or other devices. OM's partner uses a variety of digital services including their website, YouTube, TikTok, Google and Apple Podcasts, Spotify and Facebook.

One young Afghan follower of Jesus, who came to faith last year through bible discussions, shared recently: "My father, who was against my faith and my mother's faith, has accepted Jesus. He apologized for his behavior (as he previously forced me, his son, to leave the house at gun point) and said he is proud of me."



From the Radio Programs and Social Media, the Afghan media ministry in 2022:

- Received 5,998 phone calls of interest
- Replied to 205,793 online messages
- Recorded over 50,000 downloads and installations of the Dari Bible App

Transform totally

PAKISTAN

Flooding in Pakistan

Since June 2022, 1696 people have been killed in flooding across Pakistan. More than 33 million people have been affected, some left homeless by the destruction of more than 1 million homes.

A health official said: "The cases of malaria are increasing due to water contamination. A lot of places are still inaccessible to health teams and the real picture of diseases would be known only after the flood water recedes."

OM's project leader on the ground shared: "Our team has been working in a village for the past five years. We are running self-help groups, a basic education program and goat project for the self-sustainability of this village. This village consists of 25 families. Our team helped the villagers to escape during heavy rains, which lasted three days non-stop and before water from a nearby stream overflowed and submerged the village to four to five feet.

Our team later provided food packs, hygiene kits and tents to these villagers. We are

committed to continue helping this village in the coming months too. At another village, a man shared, "I have a family of six members. Our food stock was washed away in the flood water. We were living under the open sky and were eating only once a day. We thank you for coming this far and providing us with food and tents."

Rubina* is a single mother with two kids and has been bedridden for the last few weeks due to illness. The floods have affected her house, and she is living in the worst state as there is no one to take care of her. When the team visited her place, Rubina was unconscious because of the weakness in her body. The team gave a ration pack to her family so they could cook for the coming days and prayed for her that God would heal her from the sickness.

Kalsoom Bibi, age 65, has no child, and her life changed entirely during the floods. She lost her husband, fractured her arm in the flood, and her house was completely damaged due to heavy rain. Local people helped her with the funeral arrangement of her husband. Currently, she is living with her relatives, and the team has helped her with a ration pack. She shared that God is still the provider for her life, and even in these challenging situations, He would take care of her.

OM Pakistan teams are still actively supporting affected families in 6 other cities. We are thankful for financial gifts from our partners that allowed us to do work, in the name of Jesus, such as provide food packages, non-food items and medical aid when this crisis arose.

In total, over 3000 families have been helped by OM Pakistan with food and shelter.

\$5 is enough

Jacob* (Zambia) and his wife Esther* (Switzerland) are part of a team that conducts micro-business training across Africa. They provide classroom training and 5 USD loans, which students use to start businesses during a ten-day practical challenge. At the end of the ten days, students pay back the loans—with interest—and share their experiences.



Chloe^{*}, a widow from Central Africa, used to beg for food to provide for her five children, relying on the generosity of others to survive. With the start-up loan from the training, she purchased small food items that she could quickly resell. The high turnover rate allowed her to generate a small income, and soon she could feed her children. She did not stop there, however.

Keeping in mind what she had learned, Chloe set aside money until she had enough to rent, and later buy, a field to plant sweet potatoes, a staple food in her country. Chloe sold what her family did not eat, using the funds to purchase other necessities and pay for her children's school fees.

to provide for her children herself and doesn't need to beg anymore," said Esther. "It was exciting to see how her whole attitude, her whole life, changed through that."

Though the training is built on biblical values, the participants are not always Jesus followers. Many people are eager to receive business training, and "we want to engage with whoever needs it," said Esther. In a few places, government officials and other leaders witnessed the impact of the training and asked for the program to be repeated.

"Most of the people that we reach out to, you cannot actually reach out to them with your Bible under your arms," Jacob explained. "Meaning that you need to have other ways through which you can reach them, and the business training is one of the tools."

TANZANIA

Pray, play and say

Abu's method to live out Christ's love on the football field in Zanzibar, Tanzania, is simple: 'pray, play and say.' Before each football practice or fitness training session, Abu calls together the players, asks what everyone is thankful for and prays for the day. During drills and games, Abu ensures he plays with integrity. Lastly, everything Abu says to the players is said with love. Through this three-prong approach, Abu has seen the young men he interacts with open up to Jesus.

Saleem^{*} joined Abu's morning fitness program along with friends. From a Muslim background, Saleem showed interest when Abu prayed for each session and was always one of the first to volunteer what he was thankful for. which was encouraging to Abu.

One day, a player purposely tripped and kicked Abu-who did nothing in retaliation. "Once we finished that training, I spoke about love, like: 'Guys: we can love each other,'" remembered Abu. Later, Saleem approached Abu, saying he had learned much - that Abu not only instructed but led by example.

Saleem visited Abu as his family started their daily Bible study. Abu invited Saleem to join

them, where afterwards Saleem asked if he could come again the next day. Later, Saleem requested a Bible to read on his own, which the family gladly gave him. Abu saw Saleem's words and actions change on the football pitch. Three months later he announced that he wanted to follow Jesus.

Saleem has become a very strong follower of Jesus," said Abu, "Saleem decided to use his ability to also help other players to follow Jesus." The young man moved to another area of Tanzania that is predominately Muslim to mobilize, teach and equip a team of 26 players.

Abu, like Saleem, is from a Muslim background and came to know Christ through football.

"We see how God is using sports as a tool to
